## What is Rally CLE?

Rally CLE exists to unite and engage residents around the ideas they have for improving their communities. We support residents in the Clark-Fulton and Stockyards communities through small grants (up to \$2,000 per project), implementation and planning support, as well as the volunteer and professional services needed for your project to succeed. Project ideas can include, but are not limited to, reclaiming vacant lots, public art installations, or community space renovations.

**September 21, 2019** is our Rally CLE event where Building Hope will gather residents and supporting volunteers to either start, partially complete, or fully complete your project. In the time leading up to that event, we will provide the implementation and planning support needed to bring your project to life!

Any resident of the Clark-Fulton and Stockyards communities is encouraged to apply. We are looking to fund and support projects that are thoughtful, engaging, and representative of the cultural diversity of these two communities. If you have a project idea for improving your neighborhood, then this is your chance to take action! There are so many possibilities! Below you'll find our application for a project grant. Do your best to fill it out completely here and once it's submitted, you'll hear back from us about the next step in the selection process.

- Projects must be able to be started or completed on September 21, 2019 as a part of the Rally CLE event.
- Projects must reflect the diversity of your neighborhood while also benefiting the common good.
- Residents who submit a project must work with Building Hope in the City to plan for their project.
- Project applications must be submitted by **July 15, 2019**.
